Abstract: The principle of justice is typically counted among the most important ethical principles in health care, yet it remains perhaps the most difficult principle to interpret and apply in clinical care. This case and practice focused workshop will address difficult issues surrounding justice and fairness in the provision of health care and management of resources, including:

- Legal protections against discrimination in health care and access to health resources
- Adverse effects of health disparities and inequity on patients' lives and their pursuit of other social goods
- Structural justice and equity in the allocation of solid transplantable organs
- Allocation of scarce health resources during pandemics, with focus on the global COVID-19 pandemic
